BEYOND DRYDEN

Playwright Oren Safdie's new play a tribute to Habs legend

The St-Ambrose Montreal Fringe Festival will officially unveil its lineup next Monday, but one show to watch out for is critically acclaimed playwright Oren Safdie's world premiere of *Beyond Ken*

Dryden, a solo show about a boy's idolization of his sports hero Ken Dryden and the Montreal Canadiens as his own family and the province of Quebec were coming apart. It will run from June 6 to 16 at Studio Multimedia, geared towards those aged 12 and up. "Ken Dryden read the play and responded really positively," Safdie told me.

The 1970s were a wonderful though

tumultuous time to be growing up in Montreal, but as Safdie notes through it all, goaltender Ken Dryden and the Canadiens remained steadfast in his life; connecting the city and lifting his and everyone's spirits by winning six Stanley Cups in nine years. Safdie's newest work is influenced by his stepfather Roch Carrier's children's classic, *The Hockey Sweater*. The star of the one man show is New Yorker Max Katz. 
